The Legend of Saucy Mary

Mary was a Norse Princess who married Findanus, the 4th MacKinnon chief and lived in Castle Moil in Kyleakin in the 10th Century. Back then, the only way to get around in the Highlands and Islands was by sea. Around these parts, it was always safer passing between the Kyelakin and the mainland, rather than taking your chances in the exposed waters west of Skye.
